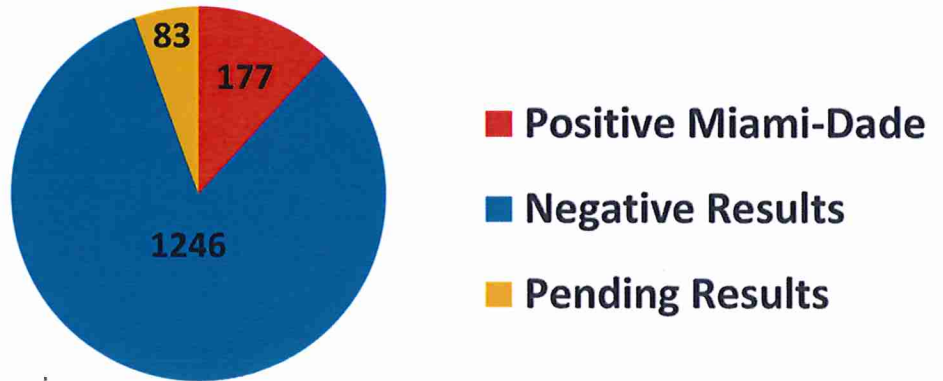

SUMMARY OF CURRENT SITUATION AND ACTIONS

- The Florida Division of Emergency Management has shipped 1,200 COVID-19 collection kits to the County Staging Area (CSA).
- Miami-Dade County Mayor Carlos Gimenez issued Amendment No. 2 to Emergency Order No. 06-20 (Attached).
- The Miami-Dade County testing site at Hard Rock Stadium is set to open to the public on Monday (3/23), the hours of operations will be from 9:00 AM through 5:00 PM, 7-days a week. A second site will be opening at Marlins Park. The dates have not yet been confirmed.

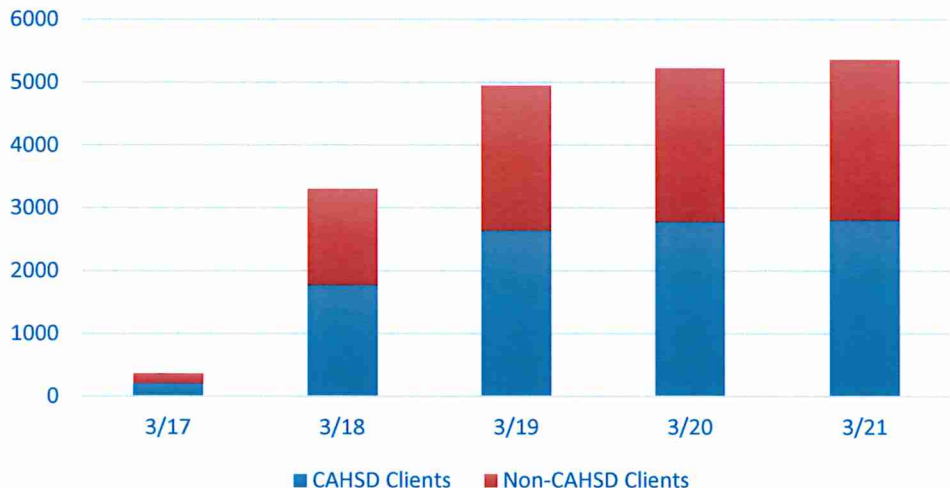
COVID-19 Miami-Dade Total Cases



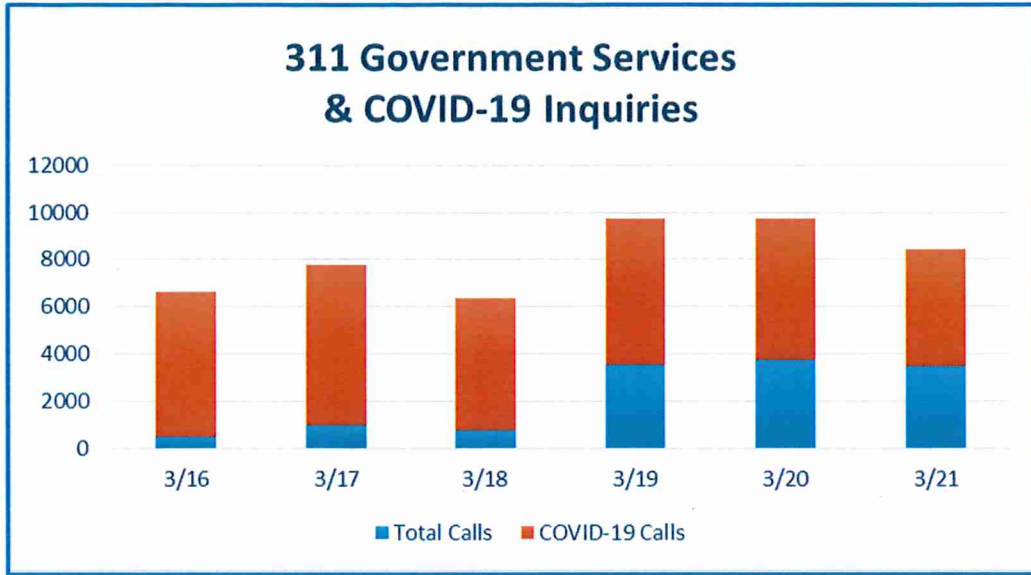
The Community Action and Human Services Department (CAHSD) is providing case management of elderly meal requests and coordinating meal delivery.

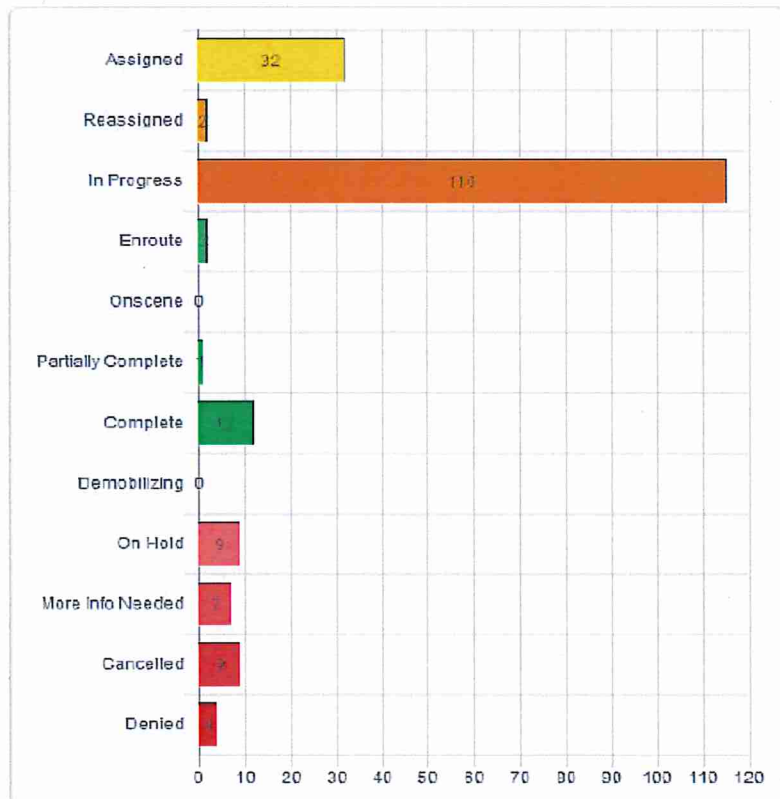

Extra food packages will be available for any senior or vulnerable population who may need it.

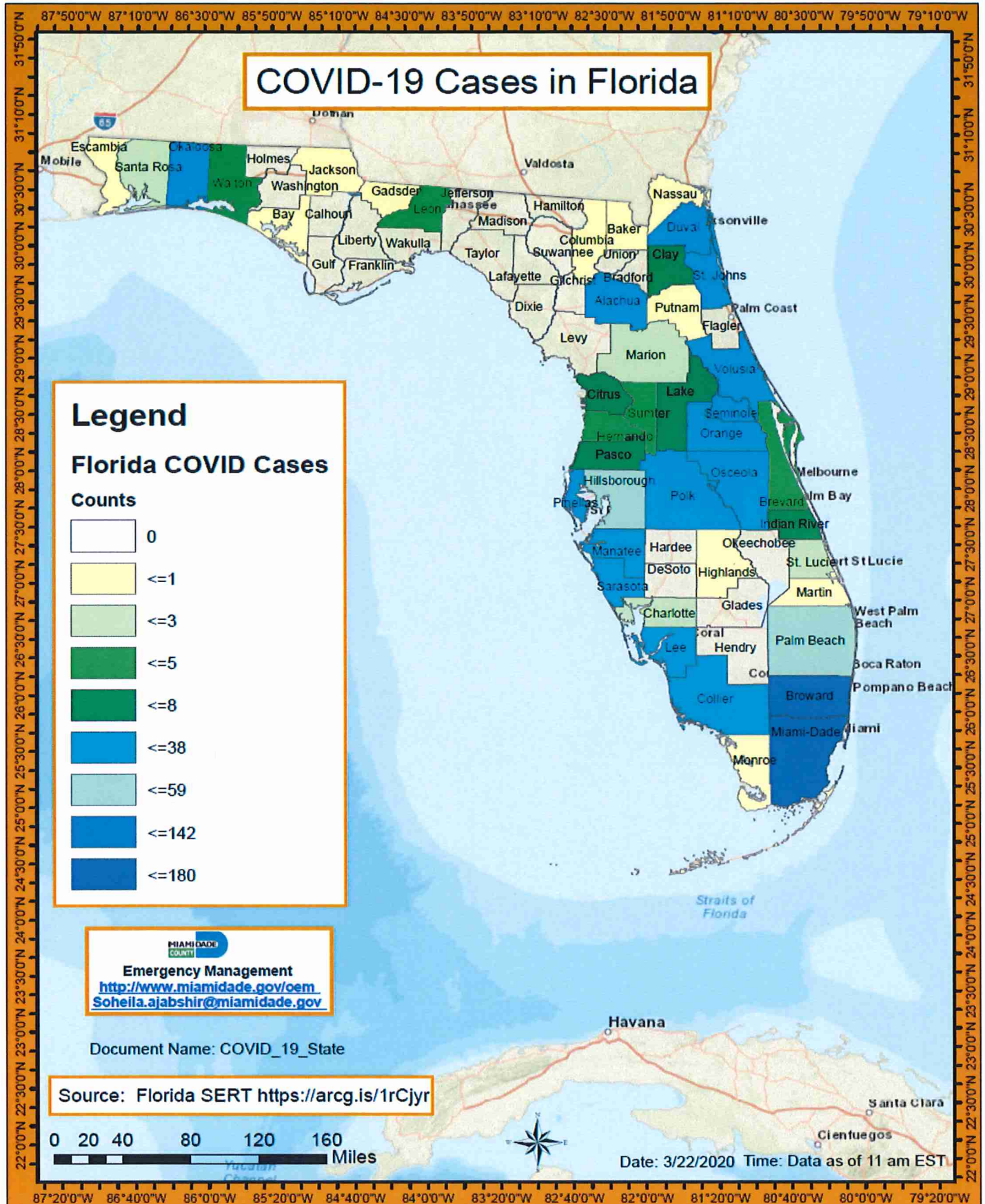

AMENDMENT NO. 2 TO MIAMI-DADE COUNTY EMERGENCY ORDER 06-20

WHEREAS, on March 19, 2020, the County Mayor issued Emergency Order 06-20; and

WHEREAS, Emergency Order 06-20 directed the closure of all parks, beaches, and recreation facilities; and

WHEREAS, Emergency Order 06-20 provided for amendment by filing written notice with the clerk; and

WHEREAS, the County Mayor issued Amendment No. 1 to Emergency Order 06-20 on March 20, 2020; and

WHEREAS, Amendment No. 1 to Emergency Order 06-20 excluded marinas, boat launches, docking, fueling, marine supply and other marina services from being closed; and

WHEREAS, large numbers of boaters continue to congregate without observing social distancing and are promoting upcoming large parties, the occurrence of which increase the risk of spreading COVID-19 throughout the community,

THEREFORE, as County Mayor of Miami-Dade County, I hereby order:

1. Paragraph 1 of Emergency Order 06-20 is hereby amended and restated as follows:

All parks, beaches, and recreational facilities in the incorporated and unincorporated areas of Miami-Dade County shall close at 9:00 a.m., March 19, 2020. This order shall apply to both publicly-owned and privately-owned parks, beaches, and recreational facilities. This order does not apply to parks, beaches, and recreational facilities under the jurisdiction of the State of Florida and the federal government. ~~[[This order shall not apply to marinas and boat launches, docking, fueling, marine supply and other marina services. Miami Dade County owned and operated marinas and boat ramps shall remain open from 7 a.m. to sunset.]]~~

>>All marinas and boat launches, docking, fueling, marine supply, and other marina services in the incorporated and unincorporated areas of Miami-Dade County shall close effective 11:59 p.m., March 21, 2020. Notwithstanding the foregoing, any person with a commercial saltwater license issued by the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission may enter and use Miami-Dade County owned or operated marinas for commercial fishing purposes. Marina supply and fueling stations necessary to support commercial fishing purposes may remain open to the extent of such support.

Miami-Dade County Declaration of Local State of Emergency

These provisions shall serve as minimum standards. Municipalities may impose more stringent standards within their jurisdictions.<<

2. The balance of Emergency Order 06-20 remains in full force and effect and is subject to further amendment as set forth in Emergency Order 06-20.

Miami-Dade County Animal Services Department providing mission-essential and critical services on a modified schedule

MIAMI (March 22, 2020) — Miami-Dade County Animal Services Department (ASD) is providing mission-essential and critical services only on a modified schedule as noted herein. Hand sanitizing stations are located throughout the facility and social distancing protocols are being implemented in line with Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) guidelines.

The following mission-essential services are being provided:

Animal Welfare Officers will continue to respond to high priority/emergency calls such as: injured or suffering animals, cruelty and requests from police officers for assistance with animals. Road-side deceased animal pick-up services also continue.

In an effort to find homes for shelter pets and prepare for an increase in intake as recognized by the National Animal Care and Control Association (NACA), ASD is providing adoptions, rescue and return of lost pet services.

Adoptions are taking place at the Pet Adoption and Protection Center (PAPC) in Doral, following guidelines for social distancing. The Petco adoption center in South Miami is also open for adoptions. ASD is currently waiving all adoption fees at both locations.

Emergency fosters who can temporarily provide in-home care for shelter pets during this crisis are needed. The most urgent housing needs are for medium and large dogs and pets with special needs. ASD will provide veterinary care, supplies, and food for fostered pets. Interested fosters can email: ASDFOSTER@miamidade.gov for additional information.

The Wellness Clinic at the PAPC is open for RABIES vaccinations only. Residents are strongly encouraged to visit their private veterinarian for services closer to their homes.

Care, cleaning, enrichment and medical attention for the shelter pet population is being provided by our team of animal care workers, veterinary technicians, veterinarians and volunteers.

The following programs and services have been SUSPENDED until further notice:

- ASD is adjusting its operating hours: Monday-Sundays, 10 a.m. - 4 p.m. These changes will allow for additional preventive cleaning and sanitization procedures
- Trap, Neuter, Vaccinate and Return (TNVR) Services are suspended
- All orientation and training sessions for new volunteers, fosters and Kitten Cuddlers are suspended. Current volunteers, fosters and Kitten Cuddlers may continue
- All scheduled and walk-in spay/neuter surgeries for the general public are suspended
- Off-site adoption events are suspended until further notice
- Animal Services asks residents to avoid surrendering pets unless absolutely necessary. This request follows guidelines from NACA, which has advised animal shelters to take extra measures to reduce shelter intake to mitigate the short and long-term effects of COVID-19
- ASD asks anyone who finds friendly stray pets to consider fostering them until normal operations resume. Pets typically stay close to home when they go missing. Good Samaritans can use the following resources to help lost pets:
 - Look for any identification on the pet, including phone number, address and/or the Miami-Dade County license with a QR code
 - Download the [Finding Rover Facial Recognition app](#)
 - Bring the pet to a veterinary clinic or to ASD to check for a microchip
 - Visit the ASD website to [register the found pet](#)
- ASD has temporarily suspended the issuance of civil violations notices associated with rabies vaccination and license renewals
- Residents may renew licenses for their pets by mail. Read more information on [licensing](#)
